5	Some beaches have lifeboat station.
6	Lifeboat stations usually have an inshore and off shore life boat.
7	Some beaches have a blue flag award. To get this they must: have good water quality, have lifeguards or life saving equipment, have first aid equipment, have facilities for the disabled and provide drinking water.

Vocabulary

Beach	An area of sand or small stones near the sea or another area of water such as a lake.
Sea	The salty water that covers a large part of the surface of the earth.
Sea Creature	A large or small living thing that can move independently and lives in the sea.
Shell	A hard protective outer case of a mollusc or crustacean.
Seaweed	A green, brown, or dark red plant that grows in the sea or on land very close to the sea.
Sea gull	A bird that lives near the sea and has short legs, longwings, and white and grey feathers.
Shore	The land along the edge of a sea, lake, or wide river.
Off shore	Away from or at a distance from the coast
Pebble	A small smooth round stone, found on a beach or in a river.
Fin	A thin vertical part sticking out of the body of a fish or an aircraft that helps balance and movement.
Flipper	One of two parts like arms on the bodies of some sea creatures, such as seals and penguins, used for swimming .
Scales	One of the many very small, flat pieces that cover the skin of fish, snakes, etc.
Coral	A substance like rock, formed in the sea by groups of particular types of small animal.
Tusks	Either of the two long, pointed teeth of some animals such as walrus.
